## WebCollect

#### What is WebCollect?

We use WebCollect to manage our members' subscriptions and events online. If you wish to access your account to check, amend your details, add new orders, renew membership, hire the club boats or book in for a social event then this is done via WebCollect.

#### How can I access my WebCollect Account?

There is a link on our website to <a href="https://webcollect.org.uk/hsc/member-home">https://webcollect.org.uk/hsc/member-home</a>
Once your Membership has been set up by the Club, you are an 'existing member' and your username is this email address, but you will need to 'Reset my password'. Please check that your details are correct when you sign in the first time and email <a href="membership@highcliffesailing.co.uk">membership@highcliffesailing.co.uk</a> if there are any errors or any changes to be made. Please do not set yourself up with an account we will do it for you.

#### How do I hire a boat / kayak or book events on WebCollect?

The WebCollect home page displays all the options available to you as a member, just click on the item(s) you would like to book/pay for and then follow the onscreen instructions. Once the item is booked, WebCollect will then prompt you to choose payment method. You will have 4 options available, 'Online Direct Debit', 'Bank Transfer', 'Cheque' or 'Cash'. We kindly ask our members to select the option 'Online Direct Debit'. WebCollect will ask you to input your bank details into the system (you will only ever have to key in your details once), this will mean that all future booking payments will be taken directly from this account. This simple step makes our Treasurer's life infinitely easier and will complete your transaction in a couple of clicks.

#### I have booked a boat, what now?

Please refer to the Hire of Equipment page within the Members-only section of the website. Here you will find location details and lock codes. Please contact our Bosun on <a href="mailto:bosun@highcliffe.co.uk">bosun@highcliffe.co.uk</a>, if you need help rigging the boats. You can book in a convenient time with him and he can show you how to do this.

#### I have booked a kayak, what now?

Please refer to the Hire of Equipment page within the members-only section of the website for location details and lock codes.

You will find the club kayaks on the racking by the Club, just unlock collect a paddle and off you go. Please remember to put everything back in the same place and lock securely when you are finished, Also remember to sign in to the book in the clubhouse entrance to let people know you have gone out. #### Who do I speak to about a dinghy park space / kayak space/ lockers?

Please contact our dinghy park manager if you would like a space in the dinghy park, on the kayak racks or to have a locker. There is an annual charge, details are on our website, and they are subject to availability. Questions regarding the Dinghy Park such as boats in wrong spaces, access to is also handled by the dinghy park manager. Email address is boatparkadmin@highcliffesailing.co.uk

Members who have paid for a dinghy space are required to display a dinghy park sticker fixed to the transom of the boat. All members should tie their boats down securely to a ground chain to avoid wind and tide damage. Also ensure that you are insured for both accidental damage and 3rd party liability.

# WHAT KIND OF EQUIPMENT WILL I NEED TO GET STARTED

As per the previous information we have club boats and kayaks for hire, we also have a limited number of buoyancy aids available for you to use but we recommend that you buy or borrow certain things to get you going on the water. If you need advice please speak to any of the sailing team / paddlers to see what you should buy, but much of the list below can be bought relatively cheaply.

#### Necessary:

- Shoes Wetsuit shoes or boots for all activity
- Bouyancy Aid There are some club ones available in the changing rooms but they may not fit and at busy times there may not be enough (these are a must for club equipment hire)
- Sailing gloves these are very handy for sailing to prevent blisters but also to keep your hands warm
- Wet Suit In our climate this will be used for a large part of the year if not all
- Smock / windbreaker to go over your wetsuit or clothing, it gets cold on the water and this will be an extra layer to keep you warm
- Hat Always handy to keep your head warm
- Sun tan lotion and sunglasses for use all year round as it is very easy to burn on the water

#### Optional:

- Helmets If you wish you can wear a helmet for sailing if you are concerned about hitting your head
- Thermals should you decide to keep going in the winter you will need these





## SOCIAL ACTIVITIES

We hold as many social activities as we can on our sun terrace and lower and upper balconies. In summer we enjoy frequent BBQ's, and throughout the year our Events Team organise quiz nights/food themed nights / live music events / to name a few. We also host event days including our annual Funday and are proud to participate in local community events such as the RNLI Funday and Blue Light event.

Our new balcony with a sun terrace provides a stunning location for organised social events, informal sunset drinks and watching our annual firework display. ## HOW YOU CAN HELP -SAILING

There are several roles needed on race days, particularly when we are racing out at sea when we need two boats on the water. During Harbour races the Race Officer (RO) and Assistant Race Officer (ARO) are shore based on the club balcony, however on sea race days we have two boats at sea and the RO and ARO are on the water alongside the Safety Boat. As per below various levels of experience are required but full training can be given in order for you to get involved and help out. You will need your RYA PB2 qualification (or equivalent) to take the helm of our RIBs.

#### Race Officer (RO)

To volunteer for being Race Officer you need to be happy setting a course, running a start sequence and taking race times. Don't forget to bring your kit if the race is out to sea.

You can sign up for duties using Duty Man.

#### **Assistant Race Officer (ARO)**

To volunteer for being Assistant Race Officer you need to be happy to assist the RO, checking sign on sheet, hoisting flags and taking times. Ideal role for someone keen to learn. Don't forget to bring your kit if the race is out to sea.

You can sign up for duties using Duty Man

#### Safety Boat Helm (SB Helm)

To volunteer for being SB Helm you should be able helm a RIB, be happy to lift and lay marks and assist sailors on the water whenever necessary.

You can sign up for duties using Duty Man.

#### Safety Boat Crew (SB Crew)


To volunteer for being SB Crew you should be able to support helm (occasionally driving if needed), lift and lay marks, assist sailors on the water whenever necessary.

#### How much is membership?

#### How can I sign up for duties?

By contacting <a href="mailto:manager@highcliffesailing.co.uk">manager@highcliffesailing.co.uk</a> you can be put into contact with the correct person for the area you are interested in in. For example bar duties or race duties.



#### When is the Clubhouse Open?

#### The club is open daily between 6am - 12pm.

Our club opening times are designed to provide ample opportunity for you to enjoy your time on the water. Please be reminded that the club is locked and alarmed remotely for security purposes. We kindly ask all members to vacate the premises with enough time to clear up and tidy away before the automatic alarm sets.

#### When is the Bar open?

The bar is open when events and races are happening at the club. The bar is also open every Ist Friday of the month. Weekly updates will be sent via the All members whatsapp group,

Last orders at the bar is 10.30pm. The bar closes at 10.45pm.

#### How do I gain access to the club

The main front door gives access to the lobby and changing rooms and entry controlled via a keypad. The four-digit code is 1793. For club security please do not advertise this number to non-members or on social media. Please do not prop the front door open and leave it unattended. If you are the last person to leave the premises please ensure all windows and doors are closed. This will ensure that the alarm sets correctly.

#### Is there Wi-Fi at the club

There is free Wi-Fi available in the Club House. The password is ilovesailing

#### Can I bring Friends or Family to the Club

Visitors are welcome and may be brought into the club by any member (except by Junior members) No person shall be introduced as a visitor more than four times in any one year. On entering the club premises the name of the visitor/visitors together with the name of the member by whom introduced shall be written in the Visitors' book provided for that purpose. You may take a guest out with you when you hire a boat but this is also limited to four times in any one year.

#### Can I park at the Club.

Members are free to use one of the three club spaces marked HSC on a first come first served basis. Members need to display a club car sticker to avoid receiving a parking ticket from BCP council. You can collect a parking sticker form the manager at the club.

If you are volunteering for duty at the club, we have 5 parking permits issued on a first come first served basis. These can be found in the reception area. Please fill in the form found in the file. The parking permits should be then displayed in your car and returned after use.

#### Does BCP Council offer special car park rates for club members.

No. There is a BCP season ticket which can be used in all Christchurch Car Parks, please visit the BCP Council website for details.

#### Is there on street parking

Not at the club, drop off your gear at the club and park in Peregrine Road BH23 4BN.

#### Or can I leave my bike

There are lockup rings for bikes around the Rib Shed.

#### Can I bring my dog to the Club

No animals shall be brought into or allowed to be on the club premises.
